

They searched desperately and fiercely for me, but as 2 weeks passed and they had to go home, I was left behind. I used my survival skills from before I was rescued by catching crickets and small animals just trying to survive. Those skills helped me survive by hunting and hiding from predators. By December, I was worn out and found refuge on a kind woman named Christine's porch, where she fed me and took me in. My purple flea collar hinted that I belonged to someone, so Christine brought me to Lucky's Place. As fate would have it, Mary Ann at Lucky's Place remembered a cat just like me had gone missing months earlier. She found my family and called them right away. It was against all odds that I had made it through the winter and that my story had been remembered after so long. I am grateful for the kindness of Christine, the team at Lucky's Place, and everyone who helped me find my way back to my family. They never lost hope and never gave up looking for me.
